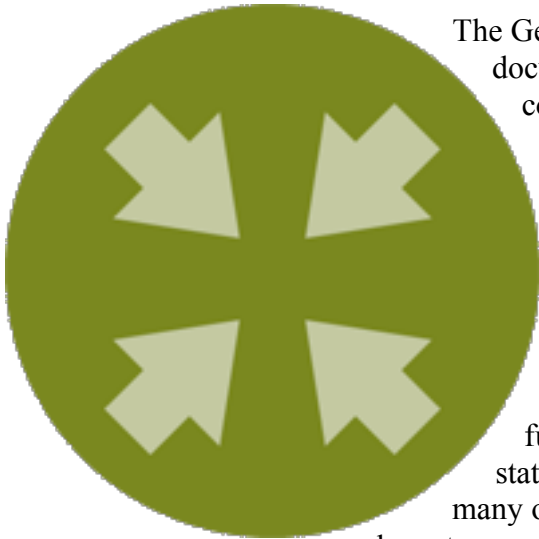


Genetic Alliance Resource Repository

Indispensable resources for the genetics community



The Genetic Alliance Resource Repository is a robust document repository service that aggregates the combined resources of advocates, healthcare professionals, government agencies, think tanks, and other contributors.

These resources include tools for organizations and communities to build their capacity and information on research, public policy, genetic services, and education.

Examples of document topics include:

fundraising, FDA guidances, advocacy at the state and federal level, and media strategies, among many others. Users can search by keyword or browse

by category. Features include the ability to track new content tailored to your interests, a “What’s New” box to see the latest content, and a “Frequently Downloaded Resources” button to view the most popular papers in the Repository. The Repository contains all common file formats, including PowerPoint presentations, Word documents, and PDFs. Contributors can easily submit their own resources by using the “How to Submit” function.

The Resource Repository is a dynamic digital library created by the community, for the community, providing access to a vast knowledge network. It is powered by Digital Commons software, an open access repository software that indexes documents across all repositories, providing global and free access to hundreds of thousands of documents. Genetic Alliance is merely the provider and manager of this repository; it is up to the community to make it their own and use it to share large files, compile robust collections, and develop centralized repositories on various issues. We welcome all suggestions.
